Carterhatch Infant School Ofsted Inspections – September 19th and 20th 2023

Dear Parents and Carers,

Following the ungraded inspection in September, we can finally share the outcomes of the two-day inspection.

We are delighted to learn that the inspector recognised that Carterhatch Infant school continues to be a good school.

Some highlights in the reports are:

Children happy in school and making "strong progress".

- Leaders have carefully considered all aspects of the curriculum. They want all pupils to achieve the best that they can.
- Pupils are often at an early stage with their reading, and staff have worked hard to improve pupils' understanding of the books that they are reading.
- Pupils benefit from the wide range of activities that enrich their time at school.
- Pupils recognise the importance of kindness and respecting others, learning that they can be 'the same but different'.
- Pupils have positive attitudes to their learning. As a result, there is no low-level disruption in lessons, and pupils are able to learn well.
- The school has quickly identified how to best support pupils with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND). Staff make sure that these pupils get what they need to learn well.

An area to improve on is attendance. You can really help make these improvements to ensure your child has regular and punctual attendance. This is so important, to support your child's wellbeing and learning. The Ofsted Parent View survey was overwhelmingly positive, and the inspector spoke positively about the results and the parents he spoke to.

We were delighted that 95% of parents said their children felt happy and safe at Carterhatch, and 96% of parents would recommend this school to another parent.

We can't see the comments on Parent View, but some were raised and discussed with the inspector. We were also informed, by the inspector, that a parent had sent him a lovely e-mail praising our school for all we do for their child. He commented that this was the first time a parent had ever gone out of their way to send a **positive** e-mail direct to him. Thank you to the parent that took the time to do this.

As always, thank you so much for your continued support with all that we do at Carterhatch. It is a pleasure to work with you, the staff, governors and – above all – the children as we continue to strive for the best possible start in life for all children.

In a twist English

We are exploring poetry in year two. The children will have an opportunity to discover rhyme, rhythm and sounds within a selection of poems. They will read and perform aloud using actions and intonation. We will be looking at the effect of onomatopoeic words and explain how they create strong images in our minds. Please use an analogue clock face at home and give your child the opportunity to share their knowledge with you by asking them what the job of each hand is, what the time is and challenge them to see if they can tell you one hour later or earlier.
