## A Message from the Reception Team:

We firstly want to say a big thank you to all the parents who attended our phonics workshop. It was great for your children to be able to show you what they have been learning in phonics so far this year; hopefully we have given you some further ideas and support in how you can continue this learning at home.

We cannot say enough just how important it is for you to be reading and practising the letters and words they are learning in school, at home as well. Children that practise at home regularly will progress far quicker in their reading skills (as well as in their language and writing) than those who do not. Please sign and comment in your child's reading records every week.

We are hoping to give you similar support and home learning ideas for maths, in a maths workshop at the beginning of the Spring term. More information will be shared nearer the time.

Over the last two weeks we have been looking at our core book 'Lunchtime' and the children had great fun making and tasting soup they made themselves in school last week. Why don't you share with us on Tapestry any cooking opportunities the children have at home. This could be your child helping to cook the family dinner or cakes at the weekend or decorating biscuits. 
## A Message from the Year 1 Team:

## A Message from the Year 2 Team:

#### Reading

Please spend quality time with your child on this task at home.

Studies have shown that "the more words that are in a child's language world, the more words they will learn, and the stronger their language skills are when they reach nursery, the more prepared they are to be able to read, and the better they read, the more likely they will graduate from school".



Several studies have shown that boys enjoy reading less than girls. An important factor in developing reading for pleasure is choice. Please encourage your child to make choices about the books they would like to read as this will improve their motivation to do so. Parental engagement in the home environment is essential in fostering a love of reading. This activity is such a powerful force and one that impacts on the progress that your child makes at school.

## Applying for Reception, Nursery and Year 3 2024:

School admissions is open – please apply for your child's school place here - <a href="https://www.eadmissions.org.uk/">https://www.eadmissions.org.uk/</a>
Reception: Your child will start school in the September after your child turns 4. You will need to apply for a place in from the October before this. Please note that you do NOT automatically move up to Reception if your child attends our Nursery. Applications can be made on line via Enfield Council website, <a href="https://www.eadmissions.org.uk/">https://www.eadmissions.org.uk/</a>
School Nursery: Your child can attend a Nursery linked to a school for 15 hours in the September after your child turns 3. You will need to apply for a place from the October before this. Applications can be made on line <a href="https://www.eadmissions.org.uk/">https://www.eadmissions.org.uk/</a>
(If you are eligible for 30 hour funding you will need to apply for funding before 31 to apply the school know that you require a place when you accept your 15 hour place in our school.

Year 3: Children in Carterhatch Infant School will need to apply for Carterhatch Junior School from the September when joining Year 2. Applications can be made on line <a href="https://www.eadmissions.org.uk/">https://www.eadmissions.org.uk/</a>

## **Parking Around School:**

Thank you to our parent/carers who continue to be considerate of our neighbours when parking around the school. Unfortunately, it has been brought to our attention that a few parent/carers from Carterhatch School are parking on double yellow lines, blocking driveways and emergency exits when collecting and dropping off their children. Although we are aware that these times can be busy, we ask that you be mindful and consider the



safety about where you are parking. Please be aware that our local residents have asked that we kindly pass on the message that they are taking note of registration numbers and will be contacting the police if parking continues to be a nuisance. Residents have also made us aware that they will be locking access gates to private car parks and you will be risking your car being blocked in if you park on their property.

## **Holiday Activities and Food Programme:**

As part of Enfield Council's holiday activity funding (HAF), funded by the Department of Education - children eligible to receive benefits related free school meals will be able to access free holiday camps and activities during the winter school holiday. Activities will include a range of sports and physical activities, enrichment activities, healthy food workshops and lunch each day. Eligible parents will be able to book to attend up to 4 days of free sessions between 19th December 2023 and 4th January 2024. The booking platform will go live on **Friday 17th November 2023**, you will **not** receive your vouchers before this date. Parents and members of the local community are invited to review the plans.


