Welcome to our first newsletter of the academic year!

Not only do the children enjoy seeing you in school but these sessions are so valuable and support you with how to help your child at home with their reading.

We look forward to welcoming you so that you can see some of the learning that takes place in school. I am sure you will be very proud watching your children learn to read!

To help support a healthy breakfast, we are providing bagels to all of our children each morning; we hope that you have all had a chance to visit our Bagel Bar. Thank you to all the children who continue to greet us with smiling faces eager to get their bagel each morning and welcome to all the new children and families that we are just getting know! If you have not yet had a chance to do so, please come and visit us at the front of the school from 8:30am every morning.

School Uniform: Refer to uniform on the Parent section of our website.

All children in Reception Year, Year 1 and Year 2 are expected to wear school uniform. Wearing school uniform supports your child to feel part of the Carterhatch community.

Our school uniform consists of:

- Green Cardigan or Sweatshirt which can be bought from the school office from £9.50,
- Black or grey trousers, skirt or dress,
- White polo shirt,
- Black shoes or trainers.
- Book Bag, which can be bought from the school office £7.00

P.E Kit can be bought from the school office:

- Black shorts or tracksuit bottoms,
- White T-shirt or polo shirt,
- Black sweatshirt or hoody.
- Black or White plimsols or trainers

All children should have a warm waterproof coat.

Earrings: Due to the health and safety for all children, only small studs will be permitted, no hoops or dangling earrings are allowed. Please note that children should not be wearing earrings on PE days.

Water Bottles: Please provide your child with a plastic bottle, metal and glass bottles are not suitable for school. We have kept our uniform as simple as possible; please speak to the school office if purchasing any uniform will be difficult for you. We may be able to support you with this.

Autumn Term has arrived!





We will ensure they have opportunities to work with more independence in preparation for key stage 2.

Daily Supported Reading (DSR)

To start the year, we will once again be opening our classrooms for DSR drop-in sessions whereby you will have the opportunity to observe your child read with their teacher in a small group and after the session there will be time for you to find out other information you need to know about year 2. These sessions will begin on Monday 18th September and your class teacher will advise you of the date, time and location.

From The Reception Team:

We are so pleased to have had your children start with us last week and see such happy faces coming in. The children have shown such enthusiasm and excitement in joining Reception and are already settling in well to their new classes and making new friends.

The children are learning about their new class routines and expectations, and we would really appreciate your support with this by encouraging their independence and good learning behaviours at home, as we will be at school. This includes things such as:

- Tidying up when they finish with an activity/toy.
- Practising being able to dress themselves especially coats, jumpers and shoes (shoes should be velcro/pull on shoes if your child cannot do up laces please!)
- Being able to go to the toilet and wiping themselves, where possible.
- Taking turns and sharing.
- Listening to the adults and following instructions,
- Reading books with your child and discussing the characters, setting and what happens.

By encouraging the above both at home and at school, it supports the children with their transition into Reception from previous childcare, as well as getting them into good habits to support their learning and behaviour.

We would also like to remind parents and carers that every child should have their own sets of spare clothes, labelled and left in school, as well as a named water bottle every day.

We look forward to working closely with you over the coming year to make your child's year in Reception a positive and fun experience for them.

Parking Around School:

Thank you to our parent/carers who continue to be considerate of our neighbours when parking around school. Unfortunately, it has been brought to our attention that a few parent/carers from Carterhatch School are parking on double yellow lines, blocking driveways and emergency exits when collecting and dropping off their children. Although we are aware that these times can be busy, we ask that



you be mindful and consider the safety about where and how you are parking. Please be aware that our local residents have asked that we kindly pass on the message that they are taking note of registration numbers and will be contacting the council and the police if parking continues to be a nuisance to them.

Acceptable Use Policy:
