Sun Safety:

As the warmer weather continues and the summer break is nearly upon us! We are reminding the children of Sun Safety using the Wrap, Splat and Hat motto. Even though most of us enjoy the sunshine we all need to follow these simple sun-safe tips to ensure that you don't not make every sunny day a 'fry-day'!

Some sun safety tips for parents and carers while children are at school:

- Ensure that your child has a high factor sun cream or sunblock applied when getting ready for school.
- If you feel your child would need more sun cream applied during the day you can send sun cream into school with your child's name on it. Children will need to apply the sun cream themselves. However, there will be an adult around to monitor this and support if needed.
- Ensure that your child has a sunhat.
- Provide children with a named water bottle, which can be refilled as required.

Remember that as a school we spend a lot of learning time in our outdoor environments especially on Forest School days so preparing for the sun is even more essential.
